Mayor Weiss opened the meeting up at 7:00 PM.

Public Comment:

Resident Mr. Martin Krasne 260 Bayberry Dr. attended the meeting in person and spoke out about the garbage and special pick-up collection in the Village.

Resident Mr. Jonathan Lieberman 1341 Hewlett Lane attended the meeting via zoom and alerted the Village of the many different invasive species that are growing throughout Hewlett Harbor.

Acceptance of the Minutes of the BOT July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022, meeting: Motion made by Trustee Cohen to approve minutes. Seconded by Trustee Bruh. Unanimously approved 3-0.

Treasurer's Report: Trustee Bruh read both July 2022 and August 2022 reports due to Treasurer Mazo being absent.

Police and Security Reports for month of July 2022 and August 2022 was reported by Police Commissioner/Trustee Tom Cohen. Mayor Weiss spoke about security officer Schmitt who was hurt while working and is at home recovering.

Hewlett Bay Fire Department Report for month of July 2022 and August 2022 was reported by VC Ryder, due to Fire Commissioner Tariq Khan being absent.

Committee Reports:

- Public Works Report: VC Ryder reported upcoming utility upgrades and vehicle maintenance in preparation for the winter. VC Ryder also mentioned the start of the Schenck Circle Road project. The Board would like to see some beautification done to Schenck Lane after the road project is complete.
- Willow Pond Update: Mayor Weiss reported that we have not needed any treatments to the pond. VC Ryder had reported some dead fish due to the extreme heat and lack of rain.

Building Department Updates: VC Ryder reported that there was a total of 17 (seventeen) building and plumbing permits filed since the last Board of Trustees meeting on July 14th. There were also 49 (forty-nine) inspections for the month of July and August.

Complaint Report: VC Ryder reported 32 (thirty-two) complaints were filed in the last month. Mostly sanitation and noise complaints.

Old Business:

New Business: The Mayor and Board spoke about shared services with both the Village of Hewlett Bay Park and the Village of Lynbrook.

A motion was made by Trustee Cohen to go into Executive Session at 8:26 P.M. seconded by Trustee Kornblau. Unanimously approved 5-0
